Standard liquid paints, even those labeled "marine grade," often fail because they dry with microscopic pores. Over time, the salt air penetrates these pores, gets underneath the paint, and causes it to bubble and peel from the inside out. This leads to the familiar sight of rust streaks running down your white balcony railings or your expensive outdoor lighting fixtures crumbling to dust.
