

# Double Your Utility With Functional Walls

The "Seat Wall" is the highest-value upgrade. By building a wall to a height of 18-21 inches and capping it with a smooth, 12-14 inch wide stone, you create permanent seating. A 20-foot wall provides seating for 10-12 people. To buy outdoor furniture for that many guests would cost thousands of dollars and clutter your patio. Integrated planters add biophilic value. By stepping the wall back to create a shelf, or building a raised box, we bring vegetation up to eye level. This breaks up the "monolith" effect of a large stone wall, softening the aesthetic. It also makes gardening accessible for those who cannot kneel or bend over.

Functionally, these walls also serve as windbreaks and sound barriers. A masonry wall blocks low-level drafts that can make a fire pit uncomfortable. It dampens noise from neighboring properties. By stacking these benefits—retention, seating, planting, shelter—you create a structure that contributes significantly to the lifestyle value of the home.
