Support responsiveness kind of tells you a lot honestly. Try asking a couple questions first, just to be sure, then commit only after you see how clear and fast they respond, like promptly. Ultimately, no one review really covers the whole story. Careful, separate research stays the safest route for an informed choice, you know, in practice.
